Reading: Deuteronomy 26:1-11

When you have come into the land that the LORD your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the LORD your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the LORD your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, 'Today I declare to the LORD your God that I have come into the land that the LORD swore to our ancestors to give us.' When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the LORD your God, you shall make this response before the LORD your God: 'A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labour on us, we cried to the LORD, the God of our ancestors; the LORD heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. The LORD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O LORD, have given me.' You shall set it down before the LORD your God and bow down before the LORD your God. Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the LORD your God has given to you and to your house.

Learning to see and respond as God does

The Humility of God:

" 'The Word was made flesh' (John 1:14 These words give expression to that heavenly mystery... that the eternal God has humbly bent down and lifted the dust of our nature into unity with his own person "

Bonaventure: Sermon on the Nativity of the Lord
Col 1:15 Christ is the first born of all creation –Christ is the masterpiece of love in midst of creation designed for love.

God's deepest purpose in creation is to enable the Incarnation, and thus the enfolding of all things into the life of the Holy Trinity. Creation is preparation for incarnation which God willed from all eternity.

Love overflows from heart of God through all creation and back to God, gathering everything into the heart of God the Holy Trinity . This means the ultimate reality is loving relationship. It is dynamic, not static. Trinity as Dance. "Lord of the Dance"

Rom 8:22 “We know the whole creation groaning in labour pains til now.”

Philippians 2: 1 – 8 “.....Let the same mind be in you, that was in Christ Jesus....”

Imaginative prayer with gospel stories – Allow the Holy Spirit to lead you. Be one of the characters, or an on-looker. Absorb how Jesus sees and responds

As we’re transformed more fully to clearly reflect God’s image we play our part in transformation of the world.

Praying with news media – Recognising Christ in vulnerable, marginalised, flawed and broken people “Just as you did it to one of the least... (*Matthew 25: 40*)

Including the wounded, flawed and broken areas of our own lives, communities, institutions etc. “Just as I am O Lamb of God I come”.

Where is God in this situation? What is God doing? What is my /our response?

Tools for prayer around social justice issues

Bible Passages about Social Justice:

If in any of the towns in the land that the Lord your God is giving you there is a fellow-Israelite in need, then do not be selfish and refuse to help him. Instead, be generous and lend him as much as he needs. *(Deuteronomy 15:7-8)*

I, the Lord, command you to do what is just and right. Protect the person who is being cheated from the one who is cheating him. Do not ill-treat or oppress foreigners, orphans, or widows; and do not kill innocent people in this holy place. *(Jeremiah 22:3)*

No, the Lord has told us what is good. What he requires of us is this: to do what is just, to show constant love, and to live in humble fellowship with our God. *(Micah 6:8)*

Rich people who see a brother or sister in need, yet close their hearts against them, cannot claim that they love God.
(1 John 3:17)

Suppose there are brothers or sisters who need clothes and don't have enough to eat. What good is there in your saying to them, "God bless you! Keep warm and eat well!" – if you don't give them the necessities of life? *(James 2:15-16)*

Learn to do right. See that justice is done — help those who are oppressed, give orphans their rights, and defend widows.
(Isaiah 1:17)

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has chosen me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind; to set free the oppressed and announce that the time has come when the Lord will save his people." *(Luke 4:18-19)*

None of you should be looking out for your own interests, but for the interests of others. *(1 Corinthians 10:24)*

Share your belongings with your needy fellow Christians, and open your homes to strangers. *(Romans 12:13)*

Don't take advantage of the poor just because you can; don't take advantage of those who stand helpless in court. The Lord will

argue their case for them and threaten the life of anyone who threatens theirs. (*Proverbs 22:22-23*)
