Other areas of our life that have moved into the virtual realm is our Sunday Eucharist which can be accessed through our website, Morning Prayer, our Wednesday Bible Study group and our Friday morning meditation group. Even though the Church building is closed you will be delighted to hear that the restoration and refurbishment of the rooms behind the Royal Gallery and the staircase leading to the Royal Gallery are now all but complete. This means that when we do return to being able to use our building we will have more space in which to develop our ministry. The new area will also provide a renovated room for the choir to use to store their robes and library space for their music. This restoration has been made possible by your generous response to our appeal for specific funds for this project. Such generosity has borne good fruit!

Looking forward to later on in the year we will need to hold our Annual General Meeting at which we will be looking to elect eleven to the Parochial Church Council (PCC) of which five will also serve on the Deanery Synod (DS). Being a member of the PCC or DS gives you an opportunity to be proactively involved with aspects of the fabric & finance and ministry and mission of St Anne's. If you would like to know more about what becoming a member of the PCC or Deanery Synod may involve please do contact one of us.

It is also our policy to support three charities each year who share in 5% of our net income from your giving. We usually support each of these charities for a three year period and 2020 is the year when we will be choosing new charities to support. As a general rule we

try to choose one overseas charity, one national charity and one local charity. We are asking you for your suggestions of charities for the PCC to consider. The qualifying criteria for a charity to be considered is that their aims broadly fit in with values that we have at St Anne's and that they are well administered. So in this period of lockdown please give some thought to this subject and let Fr. Nigel have your proposals. The PCC will be deciding on which charities to support in the autumn.
