## Sermon

## The Nicene Creed

*Please stand*

**All We believe in one God,  
the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all that is,  
seen and unseen.  
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
the only Son of God,  
eternally begotten of the Father,  
God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God,**

begotten not made,  
of one Being with the Father;  
through him all things were made.  
For us and for our salvation he came down from  
heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the  
Virgin Mary and was made man.  
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;  
he suffered death and was buried.  
On the third day he rose again  
in accordance with the Scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the  
dead, and his kingdom will have no end.  
We believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,  
who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and  
glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.  
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.  
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of  
sins.  
We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come.  
Amen.

Jesus knew hurt and pain.  
Through him you wipe away our tears,  
and fill us with your peace.

You made us all,  
each wonderfully different,  
to join with the angels  
and sing your praise:

God of power and might,  
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.  
Blessed is he that comes in the name of the Lord.

We thank you, loving Father,

On the night before he died,  
when darkness had fallen,

and shared it with his disciples, saying:  
'This is my body, given for you.  
Do this to remember me.'

After they had eaten, he took the cup of wine,  
gave thanks, and shared it with his disciples, saying:  
'This is my blood, poured out for you and for many,  
for the forgiveness of sins.'

So Father, with this bread and this cup  
we celebrate his love, his death, his risen life.  
As you feed us with these gifts,  
send your Holy Spirit,  
and change us more and more  
to be like Jesus our Saviour.

Help us, Father, to love one another,  
as we look forward to that day  
when suffering is ended,  
and all creation is gathered in your loving arms.

And now with the Blessed Virgin Mary, St Anne and all your  
saints we give you glory,  
through Jesus Christ,  
in the strength of the Spirit,  
today and for ever.

*The priest breaks the consecrated bread*

## Giving of Communion

## Prayer after Communion

*After you have received communion would you please proceed immediately out of the church by the south door and gather around the War Memorial.*

*The priest continues*

We meet in the presence of God. We commit ourselves to work in penitence and faith for reconciliation between the nations, that all people may, together, live in freedom, justice and peace. We pray for all who in bereavement, disability and pain continue to suffer the consequences of fighting and terror.

We remember with thanksgiving and sorrow those whose lives, in world wars and conflicts past and present, have been given and taken away.

**An older person says**

They shall grow not old,  
as we that are left grow old; age shall not weary them, nor the  
years condemn.

**A younger person replies**

At the going down of the sun and in the morning,  
we will remember them.

**All We will remember them.**

**The beginning of the two-minute silence is signalled. Colours are lowered. Silence is kept. The completion of the silence will be signalled.**

Ever-living God, we remember those whom you have gathered from the storm of war into the peace of your presence; may that same peace calm our fears, bring justice to all peoples and establish harmony among the nations, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

**All Amen.**

O God of truth and justice, we hold before you those whose memory we cherish, and those whose names we will never know. Help us to lift our eyes above the torment of this

broken world, and grant us the grace to pray for those who wish us harm. As we honour the past, may we put our faith in your future; for you are the source of life and hope, now and for ever.
